At Deddington C.E. (Aided) Primary School:

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated to pupils identified within priority groups or as individuals. Children other than those identified on the FSM register may also benefit from group interventions.

Pupil Premium funding has been used in the following ways:

- Provision of small group interventions with experienced staff. This has focused on Literacy and Numeracy, and Nurture and Behaviour Support.
- Provision of a trained Play Therapist for 1:1 support on a weekly basis.
- 1:1 tuition and small group support with teachers and appropriately trained TA staff.
- Booster work with children in Year 6.

Evidence collected indicates that the majority of children on our Pupil Premium (PP) register have made better than expected rates of progress. This is clearly illustrated in our school's internal tracking. At the end of year 6, all children eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant made at least expected progress

Where progress has been less than good for any children, careful monitoring in the year ahead and interventions will continue to be put in place to accelerate progress.
