Who are the clubs run by?

FREE clubs are led by school staff on a voluntary basis. Paid clubs are also on offer from staff members and outside agencies. (Please see below for further information.)

How do I book my child onto a free club?

Login to the school parents evening system at <https://deddington.schoolcloud.co.uk> and then go to 'club sign up'. If the club is full, you will be notified that you have been put onto the waiting list.

When does booking open and close?

To book for Term 3 and Term 4, booking opens **Friday 9th January 6pm and closes on Sunday 11th January 6pm**

What do I do if my child is unable to attend or no longer wishes to take part?

If your child is unwell or cannot attend the club for any other reason, it is essential that parents notify the adult running the club. If your child no longer wants to take part in a club, please notify the adult running the club so they can offer the place to a pupil on the waiting list.

Where will I collect my child after the club finishes?

After clubs, children should be collected from the main school gate by a known adult (unless permission has been given for the child to walk home alone)

Club Behaviour Contract

By providing extra-curricular clubs we intend to:

- Offer opportunities for fun and enjoyment through a range of activities.
- Extend and enhance learning.
- Encourage children to work cooperatively and across age groups.

Whilst attending clubs, children are expected to:

- Show the 3Bs: kindness to others; respect for their peers and adults leading the club and responsibility for equipment.
- Choose and participate in a variety of activities as directed by the club leader.
- Ask for help if needed.
- Appreciate that free clubs are led by staff *volunteering* their time .

If your child/ren have signed up to a club, parents are expected to:

- Inform the leader in writing if child is unable to attend the club.
- Ensure contact details are up to date in case a child needs to go collected early from a club due to behaviour or sickness.
- Check the start/finish times, start/finish dates and ensure they collect their child/ren accordingly.
- Discuss with club leader if your child has any additional needs to ensure the club is suitable and to enable sufficient support is provided if the child is entitled to 1:1 support during the school day (e.g. has an EHCP).

Whilst we expect all our children to behave appropriately when attending an after-school club, if behaviour is not appropriate it may be decided to exclude the child. The reasons and processes involved will be clearly explained to the child and their parent/carer.
